Dear Senor Calamandrie:

Since the matter of opening some closed Adventist churches in Italy was decided with such a striking victory for the cause of liberty under your skilled leadership and counseling, I have wanted to write you, in the hope that you would contribute to LIBERTY: A Magazine of Religious Freedom an article on the situation in Italy. I believe that recent developments following the appointment of the new Constitutional Court in your country has given us a very appealing subject for discussion.
